Our reporter from Australia


Gordon visited Beaumaris Men's Shed near Melbourne in Australia. As you know, Australia is the home of the Men's Shed movement. He reports that this shed had huge well-equipped spaces for both practical and social activities.

The lease for the two adjacent buildings from the local council is for a peppercorn rent of 1A\$ (56p) per month. The Men's Shed is seen as a valuable community resource and as such, obtains generous funding from national and state agencies.

Beaumaris Men's Shed now has every tool they need but still take offerings from the affluent area and ship surplus to country township Men's Sheds. They always accept offers to clear garages and so on. They then sort and redistribute the items, often to the local tip as much of it is rubbish.

Projects are assessed, but only taken on if the men are interested and no timescale is promised. Most of their timber/ metal is gifted towards defined projects by builders' merchants or financed by businesses.

Membership is registered annually and subscription set by the insurance divided by the number of members. Typically, this is $$50 \ (£28)$ per year. Check out the photos below:
